- Basic herringbone stitch is dense. Go up 2 or 3 needle sizes at least. You want fabric that will bend.
- Herringbone also sucks up a LOT of yarn. You will not find 1-skein basic herringbone patterns unless it's an awfully big skein.
- Herringbone fabric is perfect for pillows, bags, or anything that gets hard wear.

Herringbone Stitch is a stitch which is a base for many other stitches. It runs diagonally across the lines and is pretty simple to work with. Like the parallel running stitch, lots of designs can be made with this stitch. This is also known as Mossoul stitch, Plaited stitch or as Catch stitch. It is not as the Herringbone as it resembles the spine of a herring fish.

Herringbone Stitch

Use the flooring nailer to place nails every few inches along the first slat. Use a mallet to hit the flooring nailer, and ensure the slat is secure. Do the same for the second slat. Add subsequent slats to create the herringbone pattern, taking care to position two slats at a time.

To work laced herringbone stitch, start with a row of basic herringbone. Using a second thread (typically in a different color), weave the needle, so it passes under the diagonal stitches and over the point where the stitches cross. Originally written by Chery Fall and updated by Mollie Johanson.

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Herringbone Single Crochet: Insert hook into left strand of SC. Insert hook into next st Yarn over pull up a loop ... (make sure your loop isn't too tight) ... Yarn over, pull through all three loops. You've finished your first Herringbone Single Crochet Stitch. Repeat HSC steps in each st until the end of the row, turn.
