Literary analysis essay structure is similar to many other types of writing. It usually consists of five paragraphs: intro, three body paragraphs, and conclusion. Literary Devices, Techniques, and Elements Repetition: Where a specific word, phrase, or structure is repeated several times, to emphasize a particular idea. The repetition of the words "What if..." at the beginning of each line reinforces the speaker's confusion and fear. Simile: An indirect relationship where one thing or idea is described as being similar to another.

Formalism is a philosophical theory of the foundations of mathematics that had a spectacular but brief heyday in the 1920s.

Repetition is when words or phrases are repeated in a literary work.Repetition is often used in poetry or song, and it is used to create rhythm and bring attention to an idea. Repetition is also often used in speech, as a rhetorical device to bring attention to an idea.

Repetition Examples

Parallelism is a figure of speech in which two or more elements of a sentence (or series of sentences) have the same grammatical structure. These "parallel" elements can be used to intensify the rhythm of language, or to draw a comparison, emphasize, or elaborate on an idea.
